George the sixth, by the Grace of
God, of Great Britain, France and Ireland King,
Defender of the Faith &c. To our Trusty and
Wellbelov'd The Honourable Edward Cornwallis Esq.
Greeting. Whereas we did by our Letters Patents
under our Great Seal of Great Britain bearing Date
at Westminster the 11. Day of September in the
second Year of our Reign, constitute and appoint
Rich^d. Phillips Esq. our Captain General and
Governor in Chief in and over our Province of
Nova Scotia or Acadia in America, with all
the Rights, Members and Appurtenances
whosoever thenceunto belonging, for and during
our Will and Pleasure, as by the said united
Letters Patents relation being thenceunto had,
may more fully and at large appear; Now
know you that we have revoked and determined,
and by these Presents do revoke and determine
the said united Letters Patents, and every
Clause, Article and Thing therein contained;
And further know you that we do hereby
express Trust and Confidence in the Prudence
