- March 1. Collins sailed for Boston and Mr. Hurd arrived from there.
 - 6. Wrote per Nicholls to Mr. and Mrs West (Mrs W. was J. W. sister).
 - 8. Morton and Jaggert sailed.
 - 12. Wrote my sister per Connell.
 - 14. Went with Captain Scott to the saw mills.
 - 17. Wrote Mr. and Mrs West, mamma, Uncle John and F. Wentworth. Sont to Mr. Green to be forwarded Wilson in , by whom Mr. Green forwarded my letter to Mr. West.
 - 26. Foster sailed for London.
 - 28. Wrote my sister. (Mrs Sarah West then Diming).
- April 5. The company, with a detachment from Warburton, embarked for the Basin about 11 o. c., and arrived about two. Encamped last night about 1 mile from Sackville fort, and the 5th at 5 o.c. morning began our march. Encamped at 6 at night in the woods the 7th March and at six o.c. arrived at the first houses in Pisquitt.
- Sunday 8. Marched at 11 o'clock, and about 5 joined Capt. St. Jose at Pisquitt; encamped there that night. (th, marched with the whole from Pisquitt, and about 6 o'clock got to Minis. 10th, remained at Minis; wrote Mr. Green, and enclosed a letter for my sister to be forwarded by him. 11th, 12th, 13th, remained at Minis; none of the vessels arrived; fine weather.
 - 14. Phillips arrived from Annapolis.
 - 15. Rous, Cobb and the Dove arrived.
- 16 & 17. Fine weather the vessels preparing to receive the troops.
 - 18. Marched from the Grand Prie about 11 o.c., and embarked with the whole detachment on board the several vessels,
