- April 25. Came to sail about 5 o.c. P. M. small wind and about 9 o.c. came to anchor in Minis Basin under Cape Porcupine.
 - 26. Came to sail about 7 o.c., and at 1 anchored at the Landing Place near the Fort in Minis. Disembarked the troops about 2 o.c., and at 3 o.c. marched to the Grand Prie and quartered ourselves in the same places where we were before. The Major sent a Courier to Halifax immediately upon our arrival.
 - 28. Lt. Gorham went with a command on board the Dove, which sailed the same day, as did Mr. Salisbury, for Annapolis Royal.
 - 29. Rainy weather and considerable thunder and lightning.
 - 30. Wrote mamma on return of the Courier from Halifax.
- May 1. The Courier returned from Halifax.
 - 3. Wrote my sister and J. Green and Rogers who sailed the same day.
 - 4. The Albany sailed for Boston.
 - 5. The whole party marched about 9 o.c. Halted at 12 o.c., and about 6 in the morning arrived at Pisquitt quartered in the same houses and barns as when there last.
- Sun'y 6. Landed all the stores and provisions from on board the York; in the afternoon she sailed for Annapolis.
 - 7. The courier arrived from Halifax with counter orders, upon which Philli, 3 was sent to order Rous up to take off the stores, who got up the same night. George Hill returned with two Frenchman prisoners which he took at Cobequitt.
 - 8. Put all the stores and provisions on board the Dove. Wrote
 - 9. About 6 o.c. the whole detachment marched from Pisquitt, and got to Minis about 2. The Bove arrived at same time. Phillips went to Pisquitt for the timber left there; was fired upon by some Indians and French, and the 10th returned to Minis.
 - 14. Phillips and Rous returned from a cruise, having had a skirmish with the French and Indians.
 - 15. Wrote to Mr. Green and enclosed a letter for my sister.
 - 21 Received letters from my sister and Mr. Pierce.
