22. Wrote to Mr. Green and Capt Mangee; wrote my sister 25th by Mr. Gorham.
29. Arrived Tucker with provisions.
- Octo. 3. Arrived Gordon from Minis with provisions and the Govn Letters, in whom came Mr. Glasier, &c, and letters from many of my friends.
4. Wrote my sister and Mr. Treadwell; enclosed one in it. Capt Howe killed by the enemy. Callopp arrived from N. York.
5. Foss and Lowell sailed.
7. Arrived Cobb with the other transports from Annapolis Royal.
8. Arrived Mr. Frankland from Minis.
10. White sailed for Halifax. Wrote by Capt Cotterel to Mr. Saul, Mr. Buckley and Mr. Green, and by Mr. Gorham to Annapolis. Mr. Dyson sailed in McNeil to Annapolis Royall.
11. Manger's schooner taken and burnt. It began to snow in the evening and continued 24 hours.
12. Wrote my sister by the Fair Lady, Capt Robie.
27. Cobb sailed for Annapolis, as also Mr. Steel for Pisquitt.
28. The Fair Lady sailed. Tucker and Gordon sailed, and McKown arrived from Annapolis.
30. Celebrated His Majesty's birth day. Saluted with 11 cannon, drank His Majesty health, success to the Colony and prosperity to Fort Lawrence.
- Novr 5. Arrived schooner from Annapolis with cools.
4. Arrived Taggart and Danniels.
17. The Hound, sloop, sailed. Wrote my sister by Taggart via Halifax, enclosed to Mr. Green. Wrote Mr. Saul and Mr. Buckley, and sent the returns of provisions. The Indians took 5 prisoners in sight of the Fort.
18. Arrived Dungun with provisions from N. York.
19. The French and Indians fired upon the N. York sloop, but were beat off by our cannon and Royalls.
