the thirtieth fifth Day of November 1751 by his note of that
Date for a value received promised the Plaintiff to pay him the
sum of seven pounds nine shillings and four pence lawful
money upon Demand with X justly & fully paid yet
the Deft al sed requested has not paid said sum to
the Plaintiff as aforesaid nor any Payment there of out
Duty to do it

In the damage of the said Henry (as he saith) the sum of nine pounds which
shall then & there be made to appear with other due damages & have you there
this writ with your dowses therin witness Nicholas Scher Esq at Plymouth
this 19th Day of March in the 32^d year of our Reign and Domini
