Dear Sir,

Agreeable to what I mentioned to you in my letter of the 5th instant, Major General Campbell has directed Two thousand pounds Sterling to be sent round to St. John in Charge of Captain Coffin of the Thistle Frigate, for the purpose of defraying Contingent and Extraordinary Expenses of the Army in New Brunswick. — And as the General means to embrace the very first opportunity that offers of returning to Great Britain, he has thought it proper to consign the said £2000, to His Excellency Governor Carleton (who is to succeed the General in the Command of the Troops in this District) as probably that sum will be accounted for in His Excellency's Military Administration. —

I hope this measure will prove agreeable to you, and that His Excellency Governor Carleton will be pleased to continue ^{you} in your present Office of Dy. Paymaster &c.
