Dear Sir

Since my letter to You, dated in Feby,
we learn that on the departure of General Campbell from
this place, the Command of the Troops will devolve on
Colonel Carleton, Your Governor; — from which approach-
ing change we have reason to conclude (the Head
Quarters being removed to N. Brunswick) a total anni-
hilation of the Military Secretary's Office here, You will
therefore pardon my being particularly anxious about
my Situation, and, as Governor Carleton must be here
before the General departs of entreating Your friendly
Officers with him in my behalf. — From my family
connections I own to You a Provision here would be
most agreeable. — Yet should any thing ^{in the smallest degree} preferable
offer in your Province, I would cheerfully embrace it,
as I have no Relation from whom I have the least
expectation, nor am I burthened with any other Family
than Mr. Pittain.
