Dear Sirs.

^{Yet} I cannot answer your question relative to an assurance for stopping the proclamation at the end of six months — The peculiar circumstances which attended the issuing the last proc. have produced some serious observations from me. When they are well digested I expect an explanation of the principles on which they proceeded & on which they intend to proceed. — I have not seen the Chief since I returned. My conversation has been with the Gov. I shall keep you informed of every thing.
