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Sir,

A call of Captain M. Gills has  
given me a few minutes to congratulate you on your  
arrival in this country, and on your appointment to  
the command of the province of Upper Canada,

An event which is considered as of great importance  
to His Majesty's remaining Dominions in America  
and which has <sup>created</sup> given additional <sup>to</sup> confidence in the hands of  
every consistent and determined friend to the British  
constitution.

Immediately after the cessation of  
hostilities I came to this country, and have since  
been unremittingly employed in exertions to settle  
it — In various public stations I have assisted  
to form and organize the Government — to establish  
courts — to distribute lands &c — and have had a fair  
opportunity
