First find out the River Saint Croix, from whose source
A line that's extended due north in its course
Thro' the country will strike on the highlands which rest
of Jam'd Nova Scotia the angle Northwest -

Then westward along the said highlands extend it
To south of what Stremns with S^t. Lawrence are blended

Connecticut river, s northwesternmost source

These lakes with each other by streights are connected
All which by the line must be duly bisected

Ontario - Erie and Huron these - name -

And wide spread Superior - west of the same -

The last mentioned lake the said line passes thro'
To north of Isle Royale of Pheipeaux too -

Proceeding still farther the same must be trac'd
Thro' long lake of Woods' lake that lies to north west

Till westward it goes Mississipi to find

Then down its great stream far to south let it wind
To latitude thirty done it extends -

Then leaving this river to eastward it tends.
