Sir,

I enclose a Copy of a Letter, addressed to the Lieutenant General of the Ordnance, by Lieut. General Carleton, commanding in New Brunswick; and I am to inform you by Order of Lord Howe, that situated as His Lordship is, in the Absence of the Master General, he thinks it would be highly inconsistent with his official Character, if he permitted the Contents to pass without the most serious Notice. — His Lordship feels this Duty more incumbent upon him, from the Communication he has thought it advisable to hold with Lord Cornwallis on the Subject. Lord Howe intends himself to address Lieut. General Carleton, in answer to his Letter; in the mean Time his Lordship directs me to make known to you, that considering
