

Lieutenant General Carleton's Representation to indicate a general want of Subordination and Military Conduct on your side, he can neither sanction an exchange of Commands, or your leave to return to England; nor will his Lordship feel himself justified, while under this Representation to lay your Name before His Majesty, for a mark of his Royal Favor, in case any Promotion takes place, which by seniority in the Regiment might otherwise extend to you.

His Lordship directs, that you will return to New Brunswick, and place yourself under the Command of Lieutenant General Carleton.
