This parish extends 32. miles on the bank of the river on the west side, it produces wheat, Rye, Indian Corn, Pease, Oats, Flax, Hemp, Beans & vegetables of all ~~kind~~ kinds, also Clover, Timothy, and a variety of other grasses in the greatest perfection. There are 380 head of Horn. Cattle, and 65 Horses in this Parish, also a considerable number of Sheep and Swine.

The Inhabitants in general are represented to be in a thriving state. The Lands that are cleared & cultivated, producing equal to the most sanguine expectations.

There is one Clergyman for the two parishes of Woodstock & Northampton.

There is an extensive tract of vacant Land in the rear of Woodstock, stretching to westward, as far as the American line, and to the North for more than 35 Miles. Those who have viewed it report it to be superior for cultivation, to any that have been explored in these parts. The Woods are open, and the Timber of the best quality that the Province produces.
