My Dear Sir,

After some inquiry I have ascertained. that a box for you came out ~~from~~ in the ship Suspension - Capt^r. Simonds, and was put on board of Legges ship. - from whom I presume you will be able to obtain a farther account of it. -

I am happy to find that you approved of my measures respecting the Chediac Seizure. - The timber has been sold a second time for 5/ per ton. - and the gross amount of the proceeds will be about £ 37. This sum, after deducting all the costs of the prosecution, will I presume leave a balance of about £ 10 in the Registry of the Court. - The proceeds of the sale have not as yet arrived here, when they do, and the accounts are finally adjusted, I will communicate the exact result without delay. - The Papamaquoddy seizure has been considered and I am much waiting for an opportunity to send a Commission of Sale. &c. &c. -
