It is an old settlement of ^{seventy} ~~fifty~~ German families
The river is navigable for eighteen miles, and three

ally about 300 000 feet of Lumber - The growth of
the country is Beech Birch Maple Spruce Fir Hemlock
In in the back part of the country are quantities
of White Pine for masts for vessels ^{from} Five Hundred ~~Pounds~~

on at this place to advantage and ~~it~~ it is
worthy observation that the vicinity of all the
fishing settlements on the Coast of Nova Scotia
to the Banks of Newfoundland enables them to
make double the number of voyages in a season
