At the same time I beg leave to inform you that
a Mr Clewley an Inhabitant of this Town is in possession of
a House situated in the middle of the Fuel Yard, — This not
only strengthens us for Room — but at the same time is dangerous
to the Inhabitants and Garrison, as a Fire is kept constantly in
that House, — and it is so near the Coals that if any accident
should happen to it, the loss of the Fuel, & destruction of the
Town would be inevitable.

This matter has heretofore been represented to
General Paterson, & the Governor, — the latter of whom was of opinion
that the House should be removed — and an adequate compen-
sation made to the Owner, — an Arbitration was held thence
to ascertain the value, and it was adjudged to be £200. — Genl.
Paterson thought this was too much and was also of opinion
that the House and Land, were the property of the Crown! —
