Sir,

Having been informed by the Collectors of Import and
 Excise, that all Molasses and Rum, purchased by me for the use of
 His Majesty's Troops, will be subject to the Provincial duties if
 Bonded by the Merchant - and that these articles must be
 either Imported by me, or purchased before they are landed -
 I would avoid paying them.

I beg leave to acquaint you that there has been
 an offer made me by ——— Dalpout, master of a Vessel from
 Guadeloupe, of 100 Hhds of Molasses at 15th per Gallon - now
 on board his vessel in this Harbour - which are not liable to
 these Duties, and request your Direction for purchasing them,
 as five pence per Gallon will be saved to the Crown, and there is
 little probability of its being cheaper.

I have also to beg your permission to adventure
 for Candles and Oil - for the use of the Garrison during the
