

Halifax 26 Aug^r 1783. A Special Supreme Court having entered Judgment on the Verdict of a Jury for the sum of twenty three pounds Currency in favor of Joseph Clewley as ahabitant of Halifax, for the purposes herein mentioned. You are hereby directed to pay the aforesaid sum of twenty three pounds Halifax Currency, and also the sum of ten shillings for fees of Office unto Daniel Wood Jun^r Esq; Clerk of the said Supreme Court, to be by him appropriated as the Judgment of the Court directs, taking from him a legal discharge for the same. For which payment, he shall be your sufficient Authority. H. E. Esq; Major Gen^l Commanding His Majesty's Forces in Nova Scotia.

aforesaid Do say that the said Tract, piece or Parcel of Land described, bounded, measuring and containing as aforesaid is the property of the Crown, and is wanted for His said Majesty's use, and that the Real Value of the Buildings and Improvements to the said Joseph Clewley including his Damages and Expences in this behalf incurred and sustained, doth amount to the sum of Ninety seven pounds six shillings and eight pence Currency, and the Jurors aforesaid. In Testimony thereof, and according to the Act aforesaid, have hereunto set their hands and seals at Halifax this sixteenth day of August in the Year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Eighty three, and in the Twenty third Year of His Majesty's Reign.

Sir,

Having ordered a Detachment consisting of three Companies of the 82^d Regiment, to Port-Roseway under your Command, You will proceed to that place and take the Command of all His Majesty's Troops and Public Stores there.

On your Arrival you will encamp on the most convenient ground. — The Commanding Engineer (whose Instructions will be communicated to you) will point out the Spot, and give every necessary assistance for erecting Log-Houses for winter Quarters, which must be done by the Troops, and for which they are to expect no Allowance.

Repeated injunctions from His Excellency The Commander in Chief, render it necessary for me to desire that you will be particularly careful relative to the Expenditure of Public Monies; — You will not admit of any extraordinary expences being incurred, nor of any works being carried on or undertaken, within the District under your Command, except such as may be absolutely necessary for covering of Troops, or for the security of perishable Stores, nor would I have even these undertaken without my approbation first obtained unless the delay would prove
