The Brigantine Home will proceed from here to Windsor with the baggage of the 54th & 37th Regiments under command of Captain Hamilton when she will discharge the same.

She will then take on board the baggage and convalescents of the detachment of the 84th Regiment now doing duty at Windsor, and proceed thence to Annapolis Royal. From whence (after discharging her cargo) she will return directly to this place.

The Brandy Wine will proceed with the baggage and camp equipage of the Grenadier Company and detachment of the 84th Regiment to Annapolis Royal, and wait there till further orders. By order of Brigadier General Fox.

No. 56. Halifax 25^t August 1783.

The 37th and 54th Detachments being ordered to relieve the company of the 84^t Regiment under your command at Windsor, You will (after having delivered up the Post and all orders relative to it, and giving all information in your power to Captain Hamilton) proceed to Annapolis Royal with the companies of the 84^t Regiment under your command, taking as many days provision as you may find necessary, leaving a Subaltern's Guard to take charge of your baggage which will be sent to Annapolis Royal in the Brigantine Home.

If the roads are passable one truck or wheeled carriage (which carries the officers baggage of the 37th and 54th Companies)
