May I therefore hope Sir, that You will have the Goodness to anticipate the answer from Head Quarters, by appointing a person to take Account, in behalf of Government, of the Coals still remaining at Spanish River; and (for the greater ease and Expedition,) permit me to send another to act in conjunction with him.
