Annapolis Royal 14th Sept: 1783

Capt. Jesse Hoyt of the Loyal Refugees having represented to Brig. Gen. Fox that by an unfortunate wound received in his Leg, he is deprived of labouring for the Benefit of his Family, or of affording ^{them} any Assistance, & that he is in great Distress - I am directed by Brig. Genl Fox to request that you would issue Provisions to Capt. Hoyt & his Family until May next.

It is also the Genl. request that Cha. Francis a Negroe man lately from Port Chocoma may receive his provisions at this place as the other Negroes do here.

It is my Intention to embark at this place and to proceed to the River St. Johns, as public Dispatches & other important papers may arrive here during my Absence.
