=sacre (or Masquerade as it is vulgarly called  
in King's Street Boston — — — This Accident  
has been made great use <sup>of</sup> to inflame the minds of  
the Americans — as a cruel wanton piece of but-  
=chery — I regret none of the 5th of March Orators  
ever pretended to question the impartiality of  
the Court who acquitted the Party concerned in
