Weather Cloudy - at times misty - Wind about N - Have got in the Cyder & Turnips -

Thursday Nov 8 - Rec^d on board some apples from Col^d Prince - after much altercation we got almost to a wrangle - It was agreed to leave ^m to a Survey - & Col^d Lovett survey'd them - who ordered ^m to be call'd - I call'd out one half also sent back his beef much against his liking

When people fall into mistakes - but yet think themselves in^t right - They are to be born with - But for a man to lie - & to know he lies & yet want you to believe him - beats all my patience - Cloudy - very little wind & variable - some little rain -

Friday Nov 9 - Started all the Cyder from the turnips into some punchons - a Snowy - rainy - raw day Wind at N. moderate - Spent most of day ashore with Col^d L -

Saturday Nov 10 Last night a severe gale of wind at NE - our Stern anchor came home - but luckily we have been kept off the shore - has blown very

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hard all day - & does so full but with some abatement - ~~rain~~ rain - & snow most part of the day done nothing to day but remove the Vessel both at till about 11 o'clock ^{am}

Sunday Nov 11 - Sent the Gondola home this morning - should have done it yesterday but the weather was too bad - aboard all day - Cloudy misty & blowing fresh at times - wind variable from N to about NE - have not had one fair day this 10 days -

Monday Nov 12 Mate & People returned from Town - Stow'd apples & Cyder - Cloudy all day evening clear - Wind about NE sometimes fresh - then moderates -

Tuesday Nov 13 - Sold Mr Phineas Lovett 18 planks & landed them - also 6 turkeys for Capt 25 62 Kinney - Call'd on Squire Evans. Mr Sanders - others in that Village for what I am 28 31 to have of them - removed our Ships 50 46 one more - our Stern anchor having 50 30 again ^{come} home - Have ^{almost} one constant gale 36 34 of Wind at N & NE with at flood makes 36 36 in very bad riding where we are - weather 36 40 711
