the Brig Britannia bound for Halifax Nova
Scotia. - Sandy Hook in Lat. 40° 28' Long.
73° 55' W - at 8 o'clock from Sandy Hook sighted
bore NW 6 N. distant 6 leagues - from which
we take our departure under convoy of the
Warwick a 50 gun Ship & the Garland
frigate with about 23 sail in company
