Monday 21 - Had an interview wth the Gov^r
- he is very much surprised & a little angry
at M. S. sudden departure - He dislikes
Scheme of the Water lots upon the present
mode - - - - - weather Cloudy - wind S

Tuesday 22. Today the Gov^r. came on shore
swore in 5 Justices of the Peace. viz Jas
McEwen. Jas Robinson Joseph Synner
- Durfee & myself - Henry Balw Knox
Notary Publick. - Murray Coroner
The name of this place Shelburne.

Shelburne July 1783

Dined with the Gov^r. on board Capt Mowat
Day pleasant weather warm -

Wednesday 30 - The Gov^r. left this last
Saturday (I think it was) - before he sail-
ed arrived 3 Transports from York with
about 90 Families - These with about as
many more who come from all parts
are now to be located on house lots - I have
nobody to assist me - Lyman is gone to
Annapolis - Mason is upon 4 50 acres
lots - so I have it whole of this upon my
own hands - wrote J^r Lyman to C. W.

Friday August 1 Ever since Monday have been
constantly in the Woods laying out Ground for Town
Lots for about 200 people - Thursday excepted the
