18 - Cloudy - moderate. little Wind - westerly & in P.M. Easterly blows fresh & rains before noon to 4 Westw. with rain -

19 Last night a great Thaw with has spoiled Fine Sleighting - To day Serene - wind ^{Strong} NWly fresh Gale - not cold -

20 Serene - Wind N Westerly. moderate both wind & cold - in short exceedingly pleasant
