to a large Rock 10 or 12 feet high about 100
the Water - it's face perfectly smooth - having
a crack crossing it. a rugged piece jutting
some part of the smooth face - right at
the jutting part - & in the smooth face all

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two Holes - a little way into the rock & about
two inches asunder - on the top of the Rock
& close upon it's edge are two pines about
12^{or 15} feet asunder one dead the other living

- This lot is skirted all along the River
side with meadow from 1 to 2 Ch wide
The Timber on the upland chiefly hard
wood as Birch Poplar - Butler Nutt. &
with some few pines & Spruce
