531 a Pine 5 1/2 miles + 13th from forks with a Red Ponil — I had my Provision being almost expended — one of our two axes broke one of my best men. having intirely broke his Snow Shoes to pieces. I gave over the Survey & pushed on with 2 men only.

Tuesday 28 — This day had the track to make — marched abt. 15 miles — encamped

March 1 — Reached the Portage abt. noon having marched not more than 8 miles — the travelling very heavy — got abt 2 1/3 over the Port. & encamped near a Beaver dam — I reckon if Port. not more than 7 miles

Thursday 2 — came down the Gaspeaux about 14 miles — encamped — this day had a track made for us by a hunter whom we met at the Portage.

Friday 3. a fair morning travelled about 2 miles & came upon Salmon River & abt 2 miles down that River came to an Indian Village it now began to rain hard — we halted —

Saturday 4 Sunday 5 — detained by the weather with the Indians — a very tedious disagreeable delay —

Monday 6 Set out — & about noon arrived on the Grand Lake waded across the head of it abt 1 mile ankle deep in water to an English house on the N side there tarried for the ice to make —

Tuesday 7 — came down the Grand Lake to Grimrofs — expence at Bartons 5/-

Wednesday 8 — Left Grimrofs & got down to Roger's on the Kenepicassius —
