- this is in consequence of Mr Wallace of
N York very ungenerous unfair conduct respecting
me. I had made for him on the Britannia
from N York in 1781 - I shall make reprisal

Thursday 12 This day Shipp'd J Winslow Esq a far-
mer Carpenter & Labourer - wrote
him & inclosed the Carpenters A-
greement.

Monday 16. had an interview wth Mr Lane of
London - our proposition not accepted
that House intending to bind all y^e trade
to y^e W Indies
