Wednesday 25 To day taken by a single writ at the suit of John Burnam who -
 - is a most unfortunate accident to me - had it wind been Wly last night I should have been out of reach of it -

Paid Mrs Minot for my board up to yesterday - I begin a new to day wrote to Winslow - by Bliss - sent a duplicate of my certificates - forwarded all my N.B. letters

Saturday 28 - By accident Marston Watson came to town & was informed of my distress by Mr Amory who was my bail to this time - ^(Watson) he has voluntarily & unasked taken the whole matter upon himself - to the greatest favour that was ever done to me by any man - if I had not

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not liberated I should have got entangled in my old affairs it would have proved an inextricable Labyrinth - My Creditors must now take my estate - there is no to satisfy them all -
 This evening I intended to have embarked with S. Bliss - they had just got under way when I hailed them - Bliss answered - but would not stop for me -
 So on

Sunday 29 I got into the Stage & came to Providence - & am now on

Monday 30 Ship'd in a packet for N York
