Thursday 3. arrived at N York & the same day sailed for Digby in N Scotia in a Sloop Brothers. Capt. Walton master

Sunday 6. arrived this morning safe at Digby — I feel myself exceedingly happy to have got so handsomely clear of the N England intanglement & to be again safe under the protection of British Government — I am now anxious about what will be the event of this excursion to N.E. should it produce the end designed it will ^{afford} ~~render~~ me ^{many comfortable reflections} ~~the great satisfaction~~ ^{living} — Should it fail of the effect hoped for — It won't be the first disappointment I have met with — & I must do as well as I can —
