Sunday 26. Last night sailed for Britain The Caton - Pallas & 5 or 6 Transports - 1st And. Hammon & family & divers other passengers in this fleet - among whom are several Officers of some Independent Companies who came here last Summer - They made my Landlad Sutherland's ^{or} head quarters & such another sett of riotous Vagabonds never were - now they are gone we have some peace -

29th. The Observer sailed for Nyorka -

Feb. 16. These 4 or 5 days past the harbour has been entirely choaked up with ice - & quite off to sea as far as eye could reach - People passed safely back & forth to Dartmouth - Since yesterday the mouth of the Harbour has cleared along the Western shore so that a Brig got in with some difficulty
