Phil Earl about the Nets.

The meadows remain cover^d with
the last snow. The River Ice not
started.

30th. NW. Wind, not very cold. —
Sow^d. Clover seed on the snow in the
Bye. field. Rose Cow Calv^d. —
Henry & John clearing.
Letters from Tom go. New snow melts.

May 1st. This month comes in pleasantly.
Rake^d the manure off of the Asparagus
beds. Henry splitting fitch pole stuff.
The Ice starts.

2^d. The Ice moves off very quietly.
Rain the principal part of the day.
Some thunder in the Evening.

3^d. NW. Wind - rather cold. —
mending fences.

4th. Fair weather - Chilly.
set byke.

Sunday
5th. Cloudy weather. at the General's
went in a canoe. a few fish.

6th. Pleasant - remov^d? cucumber plants
into 2^d. Hotted. Judge Saunders gins
call^d? Planted Pepper seed in
1st. bed.

7th. E Wind, chilly. Sow^d. Lettuce.
savoury & Early Cabbage, & some brown
mustard in 2^d. bed. also 3 or 4
cucumber seed in each hill. —
Sow^d. 1 bed Parsley in Hotted Yard,
Rain Ev^g. John absent a day
after canoe.

8th. Rain all day. John trimming Orchard.
Henry spreading Manure. put out Cabbage
stalks. —

9. NW cold Wind. M^l. Corvitz opening potatoe
holes. John sick. Beauty Cow Calv^d.

10. Began plowing in Orchard. Frost
last night. Finish^d. upper end of
orchard &c. Sow^d. 1 bed beets, 1 Penins
& 4 Carrots. Rain Ev^g.
Got up Runn of Madasses & Lombardy
Poplar trees.

11. Planted Pease, a few potatoes, &c. in garden.
Fish in abundance.
