25. Recat<sup>d</sup> in the bay. —

26. Anchor<sup>d</sup> off Partridge Island 7 o'clock am. & Landed in Capt Edington's boat about eleven. Mr. Chipston deliver<sup>d</sup> me a packet containing His Majesty's Mandamus appointing me a Judge of the Supreme Court, also a number of other letters from Col. Nuttall &c, which, during my absence had been rec<sup>d</sup> in various mails & deposited in his hands.

27. Deliver<sup>d</sup> The King's Mandamus to John Robinson Esq<sup>r</sup> private Secretary to the President to be communicated to His Honor. " " "
