W.B. Yesterday a letter dated at S^t John's Newfoundland 23rd Sept. 1806. directed to Ensign Wentworth Winslow. Nova Scotia Reg^t County of York Fredericton New Brunswick. - was deliver^d by M^r Edward Winslow. Miller in my presence to Ensign Wentworth Winslow. The letter is sign^d Adrian Guyonze Capt Com^d Nov: Scot. Reg^t & requires M^r Winslow to join the reg^t on the first occasion that offers &c. Ed Winslow.
