The first township on the west side is Conway. It contains by estimation 50'000 acres, it is bounded on the south by the Bay of Fundy - on the east & northeast by the river St. John's, and on the north partly by Glazier's land, and on the west by Unglanted lands. — Musquash Cove near the westernmost point of this township is a good harbor, and contains from its entrance to the Falls (about eight miles) at least 2000 acres of very good salt marsh, which may be easily dyked. The upland in the vicinity of the marsh is in some places exceedingly rocky & mountainous, and in others cold & barren, there are two falls where good mills may be
