

Land on the borders of the Island is excellent. This is said to be the property of John Butler Esquire, and others, purchased by him of Joseph Gerrish Esq; who purchased it from Sir Robert Wilmot, to whom it was originally granted. — There has never been any settlement or improvement made on this Island by the proprietors. The 4<sup>th</sup> is lower Musquash Island, which is near 3 Miles long, but is chiefly Lake and very low Supper Meadows — on the

the border is a small quantity of good land. The 5<sup>th</sup> is upper Musquash, which contains about 200 acres; it has a Lake in the middle but not so large in proportion, and is very good Land on the borders. The 6<sup>th</sup> is Grimsby or Ile Metiere, which contains about 200 acres of very good Land; the 3 last of these Islands belong to Gage Town.
