

to Swan Creek; the lower part, as far as the head of Long Island, is very good Land. From this to Grimrock Creek it is very indifferent. Between Grimrock creek and the main river is a peninsula containing 1900 acres of valuable Land, all interval — From thence to the upper end of the Town is tolerable interval and up-land. This township is also escheated to the Refuges.

The Washademoak River on the east side St. Johns, which

which bounds the Township of Amesbury on the North part, runs about north east, and is poor barren Land, on both sides from its mouth 70 miles, from thence is a carrying place to Placidia about 18 miles bad Land. There is a small piece of ungranted Land settled by 3 Families, on the North west side of Washademoak River, which is tolerable good about 2 miles on the River.

Then comes a tract of Land granted to Captain William Spry extending as the river winds 10 or 14 miles, including Lemseg
