

Next to Paulet's is a tract of 2 miles in front granted in 1705 to Samuel Morris and others. It is similar in quality to the one described last and settled agreeable to the conditions of the Grant.

The next Town is Mangerville, about 15 miles as the river runs, Granted about 18 years ago, and is divided into lots and generally settled. 10 Lots of this Township, together with an Island called Manger's Island, containing 500 acres of good Land, were originally

originally granted to Joshua Manger and other Gentlemen in England. These Lots are settled by Tenants at the rate of 3£ a year for each Lot. On the Island are only two families. There are 2 other Islands belonging to Mangerville, the first, called middle Island, about 280 acres, & the other Oromoto about 400 acres, which are divided among the proprietors of Mangerville and the lots are about $7\frac{1}{2}$ acres to each Town Lot.

Opposite to Mangerville is the township of Burton, ruins
