

Anne's up to the Chapel, is a large quantity of timber for Masts for King's Ships &c. beginning about a mile distance. From the Chapel, about 2 miles, is little or no interval, but the upland appears to be good. Then to a French Village on a semicircular point of excellent good interval with good upland back of it. From hence 3 or 4 miles there is no interval but tolerable upland. About the end of the Town is another French village on a spot of very good

good interval: The upland in this Township is as good as any on the River. There are in front of this Township, a number of good Islands which contain above 1000 Acres of most excellent Land.

Opposite Sunbury next Mangerville is the Township of Newton containing about 50,000 acres. From Mangerville to the river Nashwack is tolerable good Land. At Nashwack is a piece of one Mile Square granted to Mr. John Anderson. Proceeding up Nashwack, which is
