pensation is offered on the part of the said King, and his adherents, for the damages sustained by this State and its citizens, from the desolation aforesaid."

The amount of the fum claimed by the United States, for the damages done by the British forces, far surpassed that now claimed by the Loyalists. And as Great Britain must have paid for those damages, or have continued the war, had she not given up the property consiscated; it is evident, that she has disposed of it for more than an adequate consideration, and is a considerable gainer by the bargain.
