§. 9. That there was also a tract of
Territory lying between what was then
called the province of Maine, and the terri-
tory called Accadie, or Nova Scotia, and
extending from Sagadahock, eastward
beyond the river Penobscot, and into
the country northward to the confines
of Canada.

§. 10. That the same country or Territory
called Accadie, or Nova Scotia, as men-
tioned in the same Charter, was bounded
west by the said territory last mentioned,
southerly by the sea or Atlantic Ocean,
and easterly and northerly by the
river and gulph of St. Lawrence.

of all the Lands in the old Colony of
Massachusetts, the Colony of Plymouth,

power was granted to the lands
