

" St. Croix mentioned in and truly
 " intended under the name of the
 " River St. Croix in the Treaty of
 " Peace finally concluded between
 " the said United States and His
 " said Majesty in the year one
 " thousand, seven hundred and
 " eighty three. And that the same
 " River forms a part of the boundary
 " in the same treaty described.

" Wherefore the said Agent—
 " prayed your honorable Board
 " That you would form and deliver
 " a declaration according to the
 " provision of the same treaty of
 " Amity, Commerce and Navigation
 " describing the same River parti-
 " cularizing the latitude and lon-
 " gitude of the mouth and the

" source of the same, and declaring
 " that River to be the River St. Croix
 " mentioned in and truly intended
 " in the said Treaty of 1783, as form-
 " ing part of the Boundary therein
 " described."

Upon which, The Agent
 for His Britannic Majesty filed
 before your honorable Board his
 Memorial of Claim on the behalf
 of His said Majesty, and therein
 stated "

" That a certain River called
 " by the native Indians The River
 " Leoudiac, is the River truly inten-
 " ded by the name of the River
 " St. Croix, in the same treaty of
 " peace made and concluded as
 " aforesaid and forming a part
 " of the boundary therein mention-
 " ed and described."
