§. 1. Having thus shewn, that there were no circumstances in the Grant to Sir William Alexander in 1621, which could lead the Commissioners of 1783, to fix on the Stoudiac, or upon any other river, as a Boundary, or as the river by them in the Treaty of peace denominated the River St. Croix. The Agent for the United States will proceed to exhibit evidence and arguments to prove That the River by them intended in the same Treaty, is the River by the Indian natives called The Magaquadauie.
