But his holding this province as a
Tief of of the Kingdom of Scotland could
not qualify him in any measure,
for receiving the estate. There was
then, through the influence of the
Queen, an intimate connection and
a good understanding between the
two Crowns. —

§. 24. By the grant to Alexander the
title passed to him, his heirs and
