

Part Second.

That By the Charter of William and Mary in 1691, to the province of Massachusetts Bay, the whole of the country and Territory between the River Sagadahock or Kennebeck, and the Gulph and River of St. Lawrence, including what is now Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, was granted to that province; and that no line of division, bounds of restriction, or settlement or division of territory between what is now the province of New Brunswick, and the late province or State of Massachusetts was expressly made or had, by compact, or order of Government, prior to the Treaty of Peace in 1783. -
