the outermost points or promontories of
Land called Cape God, and Cape Mable, or
north and south in latitude, and in
breadth, and in length, and longitude,
of and within all the breadth and length
aforesaid, throughout the main land
there; from said Atlantick or western
sea and Ocean on the east part to-
ward the South-Sea. And also all
that part and portion of Main Land,
beginning at the entrance of Piscataqua
harbour, and so to pass up the same
into the river Newichewanock, and
through the same, into the furthest head
thereof; and from thence northward
till one hundred and twenty miles
shall be finished; and from Piscataqua
harbour mouth aforesaid, northward
along the sea coast, to Sagadahoc,
and from the period of one hundred
and twenty miles before reckoned,

up

up into the main land from Piscataqua
harbour through Newichewanock river.
And also the Lands and hereditaments
lying and being in the Country or terri-
tory called Acadie, or Nova Scotia; and
all that tract of Land and heredita-
ments, lying and extending between
the said Country or territory of
Nova Scotia, and the said river
Sagadahoc, or any part thereof.
- With all the rivers, waters havens,
and ports, lying within all the
territories so granted as aforesaid.
- And all the Islands and Islets,
lying within ten leagues opposite
to the bounds of the main Lands
of the same granted territories
aforesaid. All which is fully
exemplified by the same Charter
produced before your honorable
Board.
