

true & Loyal conquest & conquest all the country, coasts
and Islands from the Cape & River of Ingoon —
near unto Fourchu Cape in the said New Scotland
called the country & coast of Acadye following the
coast & Islands of the said country towards the East
unto Port De La Tour formerly named L'omeroy, &
further beyond the said port following along the said
coast unto Mirliquesche, near unto & beyond the Port
and Cape of le Reve, drawing forward fifteen leagues
within the said lands, towards the North, of all the which
said lands & seas the said Knight De La Tour & his Sonne shall
receive all the fruits, profits, emoluments that may be due
generally & whatsoever as of their own proper and Loyal
conquest in all right and jurisdiction & privileges what-
soever, as much or more than any Marquis, Earl or Baron,
holds or rayseth from the Crowne of Scotland according
to the Lawes or Letters Patents unto the said Lord Alexander,
and unto them granted by the Kings of Scotland, within
which country, lands & seas above named, they may make,
build & erect villages, towns, and castles, & fortresses as
they shall see good, which said Knight De La Tour and his
his said Sonne shall hold & enjoy all the said country here
above within the said limits named from the King &
the succession of the said Crowne of Scotland in fief and
title of honor and right of inheritance with the said
Sir Wm Alexander to them by virtue of the power to him
by the said Patents given hath erected & entitled by two
Baronies, namely the barony of Saint Estienne and the
Barony of ^{De} La Tour, which may be limited and bounded
equally between the said Knight De La Tour & his said Sonne,
if they shall see cause, upon condition that the said Knight
De La

De La Tour, & his said Sonne as he hath promised and
for his said Sonne by these presents doth promise
to be good & faithful vassalls of the said Sovereign
Lord the King of Scotland & their heires & successors, &
to give unto him all obedience & assistance to the
reducing of the People of the said Countrey and to enter-
tain good amitie & correspondency with the said Lord
Alexander and his heires, & all his Subjects, which
there shall be planted & resident, & shall maintain
good & faithful Society & Union, & the respect due unto
the said Lord Alexander, as unto the Lieut of the King,
the said Lord Alexander promising also on his part, amitie
societie, correspondency, assistance and protection from his
said Majestie, and from himself his lieut: furthermore and
over and above the said Lord Alexander graunteth unto the
said Knight De La Tour, and unto his said Sonne, ~~and unto~~
~~his said Sonne~~ & unto their heires & successors and assigns
forever the right of Admiraltie in all the extent of their
said lands & limits, the said Lord Alexander & Knight De La
Tour to hold & fulfill the contents of what is above with-
out ever in any sort whatsoever violating thereof upon
the obliging of all their goods present & to come & upon the
penalty of the ordinances appointed by the Lawes established
on the one part & the other to the violator hereof —
The said Lord Alexander promising over & above to make
or cause to be made more ample writing in good and due
forme according & conformably unto the said Letters Patents,
unto him granted by his said Majestie, whereof a copie
collationed with the originall shall be given unto the said
Knight De La Tour, & his said Sonne, and the said Lord Alex-
ander shall cause these Presents to be agreed unto, and
ratified
