

As the final declaration to be made by
 this Honorable Board, deciding what River
 is the River S^t Croix intended by the treaty
 of Peace, must particularize the latitude
 and longitude of its mouth as well as of
 its source, it may be proper & perhaps ne-
 cessary in this place to say a few words
 respecting the mouth of the River Scoudiac
 which has been so fully proved to be the
 River S^t Croix intended by the Treaty.

By an inspection of the plan of the
 Surveys now before the Board it will appear, in conformity
 to Champlain's authority. That its proper mouth is
 where it empties itself into that Part of
 Capimaquady Bay, ^{which was} formerly called the
 Bay of S^t Croix, and ^{now} called S^t Andrews
 Bay; and that this mouth is ^{traversed} formed
 by a line drawn from the North point
 of S^t Andrews Harbour, commonly called
 Joe's Point, across the River to the opposite
 point upon the western shore, near to
 the place where ^{Mr.} ~~Cochran~~ Brewer now lives.
 In confirmation of this, the Indians ^{produced by} of
 annexed before the Board as Witnesses on
