

let this line be extended twenty leagues from the cove, in depth into the Country, and we shall have the center line of the Grant, being an oblong whose width is twelve leagues and whose length is twenty leagues, let the other lines of the grant be then extended accordingly, and we shall find the lower or southern line of the Grant will range nearly along the north or northwest shore of Deer Island, and cross the L'Etete passage so as just to include the Bay and the lands adjacent on either side to the extent mentioned in the Grant. - The lines will have such a direction as to include the river S^t. Croix or Scoudiac a considerable distance westward of the conflux of the river Chepudnatcook with the S^t. Croix, and give just the tract described in the Grant.

Here it is evident that the Isle S^t. Croix must be within or to the northward of (53) Clam Cove, because the line in depth is to commence from Clam Cove, and pass thro' the Isle S^t. Croix as a middle point, and if the Isle S^t. Croix should lie to the southward of the Cove, the Grant instead
